Technically grown in Colombia, I've created a separate profile because it's a unique coffee with an amazing story.

WILD COFFEE

Separated by the Sierra Nevada mountains, the Kogi (Jaguar) people inhabit the far north jungles that stretch down to the Caribbean Sea. Here, the coffee grows wild among the Popayan and Mango trees. And when I say "wild" I don't just mean organic; a coffee tree only grows if the fruit from it falls to earth and takes seed!

The Kogi people have a symbiotic relationship with mother nature, and a lot of the land has been bought by wealthy European moguls looking to destroy the forests. So with my help - and yours! - we can help these beautiful people buy back their sacred land.

ABOUT THE FARM/ESTATE

The Kogi tribe use ancestral practices to foster a unique kind fo wild coffee that is probably the most sustainable coffee in the world. Trees grow freely in the jungles under popayan and Mango shade. The elders give spiritual guidance to every step of the process while the Farmers wash and dry their beans in their backyard and use mules to travel up to ten hours to the community processing centre.

All proceeds are used by the Kogi people to buy back and conserve their ancestral and sacred lands.
